Software, Artificial Intelligence, and Technology License

30 August 2026

PREAMBLE

The Beloved Community License ("BCL") is a responsible-use license intended to enable the creation, study, modification, improvement, and sharing of software, artificial intelligence, and other technology while establishing express limitations against uses that materially facilitate violence, oppression, coercive surveillance, exploitation, incarceration, serious violations of human rights, or substantial environmental destruction.

The BCL is inspired by the concept of the Beloved Community: a society grounded in human dignity, nonviolence, justice, reconciliation, equitable participation, and care for the Earth.

The BCL is designed for BCL Material that a Licensor chooses to make available, including source-available software and artificial-intelligence artifacts. It grants rights only in material expressly designated as BCL Material and only to the extent the Licensor possesses the legal authority to grant those rights.

The philosophical principles stated in this Preamble and Section 3 explain the purpose of this License. The legally binding permissions, conditions, and restrictions are stated in the operative provisions of this License.

1. DEFINITIONS

1.1 "License"

"License" means this Beloved Community License, Version 1.0.

1.2 "Licensor"

"Licensor" means the individual or Legal Entity possessing the rights necessary to grant this License with respect to particular BCL Material. Where a Contributor's Contribution has been accepted into BCL Material, that Contributor is a Licensor only with respect to the rights that Contributor possesses in that Contribution.

1.3 "You" and "Your"

"You" means an individual or Legal Entity exercising permissions granted under this License. "Your" has the corresponding meaning.

1.4 "Legal Entity"

"Legal Entity" means a corporation, partnership, nonprofit organization, governmental body, academic institution, association, or other legally recognized organization.

1.5 "BCL Material"

"BCL Material" means material expressly designated by its Licensor as licensed under the BCL, but only to the extent the Licensor possesses legal rights sufficient to grant the permissions and impose the conditions contained in this License.

BCL Material may include, without limitation:

- (a) source code;
- (b) object code and executable software;
- (c) libraries and frameworks;
- (d) documentation;
- (e) specifications;
- (f) APIs and API implementations;
- (g) user interfaces;

- (h) configurations;
- (i) prompts and prompt systems;
- (j) workflows;
- (k) agent implementations;
- (l) agent skills and tools;
- (m) orchestration systems;
- (n) retrieval systems;
- (o) memory systems;
- (p) planning and reasoning systems;
- (q) artificial-intelligence and machine-learning models;
- (r) model weights and checkpoints;
- (s) model adaptations;
- (t) adapters and LoRAs;
- (u) fine-tunes;
- (v) tokenizers;
- (w) embeddings and embedding systems;
- (x) evaluation systems;
- (y) datasets and compilations, to the extent legally licensable by Licensor;
- (z) training, inference, deployment, and serving software;
- (aa) hardware designs, schematics, circuit descriptions, firmware, CAD files, and manufacturing files, to the extent legally licensable by Licensor; and
- (ab) other copyrightable, patentable, or otherwise licensable technology expressly designated as BCL Material.

Designation as BCL Material does not create intellectual-property rights that do not otherwise exist under applicable law.

1.6 "Third-Party Material"

"Third-Party Material" means material included in, distributed with, linked to, called by, incorporated into, or otherwise used by BCL Material but for which Licensor does not possess authority to replace or modify the applicable third-party license.

Third-Party Material includes upstream software licensed under licenses such as the MIT License or Apache License 2.0.

1.7 "Modification"

"Modification" means a change, addition, adaptation, enhancement, translation, fine-tune, adapter, or other modification of BCL Material.

1.8 "Derivative Material"

"Derivative Material" means material derived from BCL Material to the extent applicable intellectual-property law gives a Licensor rights over that derivation. Nothing in this definition expands the meaning of a derivative work beyond applicable law.

1.9 "AI System"

"AI System" means a computational system using artificial intelligence, machine learning, statistical learning, neural networks, foundation models, generative models, language models, multimodal models, autonomous systems, or substantially similar technology.

1.10 "Agent"

"Agent" means software or an AI System capable of selecting, planning, initiating, coordinating, or executing actions with some degree of automation or autonomy.

1.11 "Model"

"Model" means an artificial-intelligence or machine-learning model and, where applicable, its weights, parameters, checkpoints, configuration, adapters, and associated components.

1.12 "Hosted Service"

"Hosted Service" means providing functionality involving BCL Material to another person through a network, including through SaaS, cloud services, APIs, remote inference, agent services, hosted applications, or substantially similar mechanisms.

1.13 "Use"

"Use" includes, where legally relevant, running, executing, accessing, copying, reproducing, modifying, deploying, hosting, integrating, training, fine-tuning, adapting, distilling, evaluating, performing inference, operating, distributing, redistributing, or otherwise exercising a right controlled by Licensor. "Using" and "Used" have corresponding meanings.

1.14 "Prohibited Use"

"Prohibited Use" means conduct described in Section 6.

1.15 "Output"

"Output" means content or material generated, produced, or returned by software, an AI System, an Agent, or a Model using BCL Material.

1.16 "Contribution"

"Contribution" means material intentionally submitted to a Licensor for inclusion in BCL Material by the person or Legal Entity that owns it, or by a person authorized to submit it. A communication conspicuously marked "Not a Contribution" is not a Contribution.

1.17 "Contributor"

"Contributor" means a person or Legal Entity whose Contribution has been accepted and incorporated into BCL Material.

1.18 "Materially Facilitate"

"Materially Facilitate" means to make a nontrivial contribution to the ability to plan, decide, carry out, scale, conceal, or materially improve an activity. A merely incidental, remote, or trivial connection is not material facilitation. "Materially Facilitating" and "Material Facilitation" have corresponding meanings.

1.19 "Material Component"

"Material Component" means a component that makes a nontrivial contribution to the functionality used in an activity. The mere presence of BCL Material in an unrelated part of a larger system does not by itself make it a Material Component of that activity.

1.20 "Primary Intended Purpose"

"Primary Intended Purpose" means the principal purpose of the relevant Use or deployment, determined from its design, configuration, instructions, marketing, operational context, and other reasonably available evidence. A remote, speculative, or merely possible misuse is not a Primary Intended Purpose.

1.21 "Internationally Recognized Human Rights"

"Internationally Recognized Human Rights" means human rights recognized by the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and by human-rights treaties or international humanitarian law applicable to the relevant conduct or parties.

2. GRANT OF RIGHTS

Subject to compliance with this License, each Licensor grants You, to the extent of the Licensor's applicable intellectual-property rights, a worldwide, royalty-free, non-exclusive license, continuing for the term stated in Section 18 and irrevocable except as stated in this License, to:

- (a) Use and reproduce BCL Material;
- (b) study and inspect BCL Material;
- (c) modify BCL Material;
- (d) create Derivative Material;
- (e) distribute BCL Material;
- (f) distribute Derivative Material;
- (g) publicly display or perform BCL Material where such rights apply;
- (h) execute and deploy BCL Material;
- (i) operate BCL Material as part of a Hosted Service;
- (j) integrate BCL Material into other systems;
- (k) train, fine-tune, adapt, evaluate, distill, and perform inference using BCL Material where the relevant activity requires rights controlled by Licensor; and
- (l) exercise patent rights expressly granted under Section 12.

Every permission granted under this Section is conditioned upon compliance with the applicable conditions and restrictions of this License.

No rights are granted except those expressly granted here or otherwise available to You independently under applicable law. Nothing in this License restricts fair use, fair dealing, independent development, or another limitation or exception to intellectual-property rights.

3. BELOVED COMMUNITY PRINCIPLES

The BCL is founded upon the principle that technology should participate in building a Beloved Community rather than facilitate its destruction.

The Beloved Community recognizes:

3.1 Human Dignity

Every human being possesses inherent dignity and worth.

3.2 Oppressed Communities

Technology should improve rather than diminish the lives and agency of oppressed, marginalized, and vulnerable people and communities.

3.3 Equitable Participation

Economic, technological, and political systems should permit meaningful and equitable participation.

3.4 Human Needs

Food, shelter, healthcare, education, safety, community, and other fundamental human needs are essential to human flourishing.

3.5 Incarcerated People

Incarcerated and formerly incarcerated people retain their humanity and dignity.

3.6 Repair

Historical injustice may require acknowledgment, reconciliation, restitution, reparations, restoration, or other meaningful forms of repair.

3.7 Earth

The Earth, its ecosystems, and the living communities dependent upon them possess value deserving protection for present and future generations.

3.8 Nonviolence

Technology should not be designed or deployed to Materially Facilitate violence, domination, or oppression.

These principles guide interpretation of ambiguous provisions but do not independently create restrictions beyond the operative provisions of this License.

4. ACCEPTANCE AND CONDITIONS OF THE LICENSE

4.1 Acceptance

You accept this License by exercising a permission under Section 2 that You would not otherwise possess. You need not accept this License merely to exercise a right available independently under applicable law. If You do not accept this License, You may not exercise the permissions granted by it.

4.2 Conditions

Your exercise of permissions granted by Licensor under Section 2 is conditioned upon:

- (a) compliance with Sections 6 through 9;
- (b) compliance with applicable distribution requirements;
- (c) preservation of required notices;
- (d) compliance with applicable Third-Party Material licenses;
- (e) compliance with Sections 13 through 18; and
- (f) compliance with other express conditions of this License.

A Use requiring permission from Licensor that falls outside the scope of these permissions is not authorized by this License.

4.3 Applicable Law

This License does not authorize unlawful conduct. Compliance with applicable law is a separate obligation. Conduct does not become permitted under this License merely because it is lawful in a particular jurisdiction.

5. AI AND AUTONOMOUS SYSTEMS

The BCL applies to BCL Material Used in or as part of AI Systems and Agents to the extent a Licensor possesses applicable rights.

The restrictions of Section 6 apply regardless of whether an activity is performed:

- (a) directly by a human;
- (b) automatically by software;
- (c) by an AI System;
- (d) by an Agent;
- (e) by multiple cooperating Agents;
- (f) through an API;
- (g) through a Hosted Service;
- (h) through remote inference;
- (i) through a fine-tuned or adapted system; or
- (j) through another technical mechanism.

A person may not avoid a restriction merely by delegating the restricted activity to an AI System or Agent.

6. PROHIBITED USES

The permissions granted under this License do not authorize You to knowingly Use BCL Material where BCL Material is a Material Component of the following activities.

The principles in Section 3 do not create an unlisted Prohibited Use. They may be used to resolve genuine ambiguity in the provisions below.

6.1 Weapons

Designing, developing, targeting, operating, controlling, or materially improving a weapon or weapons system whose intended function includes causing death or physical injury to a person.

6.2 Autonomous Weapons

Enabling an automated or autonomous system to select or engage human targets using lethal force without meaningful human control.

6.3 Armed Hostilities

Directly Materially Facilitating:

- (a) combat targeting;
- (b) selection of persons or locations for lethal attack;
- (c) execution of lethal military operations; or
- (d) operational battlefield decision-making directly and materially connected to lethal force.

This provision does not prohibit Use whose Primary Intended Purpose is humanitarian assistance, medical care, disaster response, peacekeeping directed toward protection of civilians, demining, search and rescue, defensive cybersecurity, or protection of human life.

6.4 Torture and Cruel Treatment

Materially Facilitating torture or cruel, inhuman, or degrading treatment or punishment.

6.5 Human Trafficking and Forced Labor

Materially Facilitating slavery, human trafficking, forced labor, involuntary servitude, or sexual exploitation.

6.6 Persecution

Materially Facilitating persecution of individuals or groups based upon protected characteristics recognized by applicable human-rights law.

6.7 Coercive Surveillance

Identifying, locating, tracking, profiling, or monitoring people where the Primary Intended Purpose is Materially Facilitating:

- (a) political repression;
- (b) persecution;
- (c) unlawful discrimination;
- (d) intimidation intended to suppress lawful expression or association;
- (e) systematic violation of privacy rights; or
- (f) another serious violation of Internationally Recognized Human Rights.

6.8 Biometric Repression

Using biometric identification or classification to Materially Facilitate persecution, political repression, unlawful discrimination, or systematic deprivation of Internationally Recognized Human Rights.

6.9 Incarceration Decisions

Making or materially automating individualized decisions concerning whether a person should be:

- (a) arrested;
- (b) detained;
- (c) incarcerated;
- (d) sentenced;
- (e) denied release or parole; or
- (f) subjected to punitive confinement.

This restriction does not prohibit systems whose Primary Intended Purpose is to provide legal representation, legal research, education, healthcare, communication, rehabilitation, reentry assistance, oversight, accountability, investigation of abuse, or protection of the rights or welfare of incarcerated people.

6.10 Serious Human-Rights Violations

Materially Facilitating conduct constituting a serious violation of Internationally Recognized Human Rights.

6.11 Deliberate Environmental Destruction

Using BCL Material where the Primary Intended Purpose is to cause substantial and unlawful:

- (a) ecosystem destruction;
- (b) environmental contamination;
- (c) destruction of protected habitats; or
- (d) comparable severe environmental harm.

Ordinary environmental impact incidental to computing, commerce, transportation, manufacturing, or other lawful activity does not by itself constitute a violation of this provision.

7. AI TRAINING, FINE-TUNING, DISTILLATION, AND ADAPTATION

To the extent an activity requires rights granted by Licensor, You may Use BCL Material for training, fine-tuning, adaptation, distillation, evaluation, or related AI development only in compliance with this License.

You may not knowingly Use BCL Material to create, train, fine-tune, adapt, distill, configure, or optimize another system when:

- (a) the Primary Intended Purpose of doing so is a Prohibited Use; and
- (b) performing that Prohibited Use directly with the BCL Material would violate Section 6.

A technical transformation does not by itself eliminate obligations that otherwise apply to protected BCL Material incorporated into or reproduced by the transformed material.

Nothing in this Section claims ownership of ideas, facts, methods, functionality, unprotectable elements, or independently created material.

8. AGENTS, TOOLS, AND SKILLS

Where BCL Material includes an Agent, agent framework, tool, skill, workflow, memory system, orchestration system, or similar component, the restrictions of this License apply to the Use of that BCL Material.

You may not knowingly configure or direct a BCL Agent to perform a Prohibited Use.

You may not knowingly Use an intermediary Agent, tool, plugin, API, Model, or service for the Primary Intended Purpose of causing BCL Material to accomplish indirectly what Section 6 prohibits directly.

9. HOSTED SERVICES AND APIS

Operating BCL Material through a Hosted Service, API, cloud deployment, remote inference system, or similar architecture does not remove the restrictions of this License.

If You operate BCL Material as a Hosted Service, Your exercise of Licensor's rights in doing so remains conditioned upon Section 6.

A user of a Hosted Service does not automatically receive source-code or distribution rights merely by accessing the service.

Nothing in this License requires disclosure of source code solely because BCL Material is operated as a Hosted Service.

10. OUTPUTS

Licensor does not claim ownership of an Output merely because the Output was produced using BCL Material.

Where an Output contains protectable expression or other material in which Licensor possesses enforceable intellectual-property rights, those rights are not waived merely because the material appeared in an Output.

An Output that is itself a copy, Modification, or Derivative Material remains governed by this License only to the extent applicable law gives a Licensor rights in that copied, modified, or derivative material.

Nothing in this License:

- (a) creates copyright in material that is not copyrightable;
- (b) creates ownership of facts or ideas;
- (c) grants Licensor ownership of a user's independently supplied material; or
- (d) automatically subjects every AI-generated Output to the BCL.

11. DATASETS

A dataset is BCL Material only when:

- (a) Licensor expressly designates it as BCL Material; and
- (b) Licensor possesses rights sufficient to grant the relevant permissions.

The BCL does not purport to grant rights in third-party works merely because those works are contained within, referenced by, or Used in connection with a dataset.

Database rights, compilation rights, contractual rights, copyright, and other applicable rights are licensed only to the extent possessed by Licensor.

12. PATENT LICENSE

Subject to compliance with this License, each Licensor grants You a worldwide, royalty-free, non-exclusive patent license, continuing for the term stated in Section 18 and irrevocable except as stated in this License, under patent claims controlled by that Licensor that would necessarily be infringed by making, having made, Using, offering to sell, selling, importing, or otherwise transferring the applicable BCL Material in accordance with Section 2.

If You institute patent litigation alleging that BCL Material itself, or a Contribution incorporated into it, infringes a patent owned or controlled by You, the patent licenses granted to You under this Section for that BCL Material terminate upon initiation of that proceeding.

This Section does not grant patent rights owned by third parties.

13. MODIFICATIONS AND DERIVATIVE MATERIAL

You may modify BCL Material and create Derivative Material subject to this License.

When You distribute BCL Material or Derivative Material containing BCL Material, in source, object, model, dataset, hardware-design, or other form, You must:

- (a) preserve applicable copyright notices;
- (b) provide a complete copy of this License or a persistent means of obtaining its complete text;
- (c) identify material Modifications You made in a reasonable and prominent manner;

- (d) preserve applicable third-party notices and licenses;
- (e) not misrepresent the origin of the material; and
- (f) reasonably identify which portions are BCL Material when they are distributed together with Third-Party Material or separately licensed additions.

The BCL restrictions continue to apply to BCL Material contained in Derivative Material.

This provision does not claim rights over independently developed material merely because it interoperates with, links to, communicates with, or is distributed alongside BCL Material.

14. DOWNSTREAM RECIPIENTS

Each recipient obtains permissions in BCL Material directly from the applicable Licensor under this License.

You may not grant another person greater rights in BCL Material than Licensor granted You.

You may distribute BCL Material only under terms that preserve the restrictions applicable to that BCL Material. Any legal terms You use for BCL Material or Derivative Material must include or incorporate the applicable BCL restrictions without weakening them.

You may license Your independently owned additions separately to the extent doing so does not purport to remove restrictions applicable to BCL Material.

Mere aggregation of BCL Material with separate material does not subject that separate material to this License.

15. THIRD-PARTY AND UPSTREAM MATERIAL

Third-Party Material remains governed by its applicable license.

Nothing in the BCL revokes, replaces, restricts, modifies, or supersedes rights granted directly by a third-party copyright or patent holder.

Accordingly, where a BCL project incorporates software originally licensed under the MIT License, Apache License 2.0, or another license permitting the combined distribution, that underlying material remains available under its original license according to its terms.

The BCL applies only to material over which the applicable Licensor possesses sufficient rights.

16. FORKS OF PERMISSIVELY LICENSED PROJECTS

A project containing Third-Party Material may designate original Modifications, additions, and other protectable contributions as BCL Material.

For example, where a BCL project is derived from an MIT- or Apache-licensed project:

- (a) the original upstream material remains available according to the upstream license;
- (b) the BCL does not revoke the public's upstream rights;
- (c) original BCL Modifications and additions are available according to the BCL;
- (d) the combined distribution must preserve applicable upstream notices and licenses; and
- (e) no recipient receives permission from the BCL Licensor to Use BCL Material outside the scope of this License merely because BCL Material interoperates with permissively licensed upstream software.

A recipient may independently obtain and Use the upstream project under its upstream license. That fact does not grant the recipient additional rights in original BCL Material.

17. FUNCTIONALLY INTEGRATED BCL SYSTEMS

A distribution may depend upon both Third-Party Material and BCL Material to provide its complete functionality.

The availability of an upstream component under another license does not constitute a license to BCL Material that implements additional functionality.

A person remains free to independently develop functionality that is similar to, compatible with, or interoperable with BCL Material, provided that the person does not copy, adapt, distribute, or otherwise exercise rights in BCL Material beyond the permissions granted by this License.

Functional similarity, compatibility, interoperability, or reimplementation alone does not make independently developed material BCL Material.

Conversely, the fact that a system could be rebuilt from Third-Party Material does not grant permission to copy or Use protected BCL Material outside this License.

18. TERM, TERMINATION, AND REINSTATEMENT

18.1 Term

This License takes effect for You when You first exercise a permission under Section 2 and continues unless Your rights terminate under this Section.

18.2 Automatic Termination

Your rights under this License automatically terminate with respect to the affected BCL Material if You:

- (a) knowingly engage in a Prohibited Use; or
- (b) materially breach another express condition of this License.

Termination applies only to rights granted by the applicable Licensor and does not take away rights You possess independently under applicable law or directly from a third party.

18.3 Duties Following Termination

Following termination, You must promptly stop every Use of the affected BCL Material that requires permission from the applicable Licensor. You must stop distributing or providing the affected BCL Material as a Hosted Service and take reasonable steps to prevent its continued Prohibited Use under Your control.

This Section does not require destruction of material that applicable law requires You to preserve, provided that preserved material is not Used for any other purpose.

18.4 Reinstatement for Curable Breaches

For a breach other than a Prohibited Use, Your rights are provisionally reinstated when You fully cure the breach and are permanently reinstated if:

- (a) You cure the breach within 30 days after You discover it; and
- (b) the applicable Licensor does not notify You in writing within 60 days after the cure that reinstatement is denied because the same or a substantially similar material breach previously occurred.

The applicable Licensor may reinstate rights at any time by express written permission.

18.5 Reinstatement Following a Prohibited Use

Rights terminated because of a Prohibited Use are not automatically reinstated. The applicable Licensor may reinstate them in writing after documented cessation of the Prohibited Use and reasonable remediation of resulting harm where remediation is possible.

18.6 Downstream Recipients

Termination of Your rights does not automatically terminate the rights of downstream recipients who received BCL Material from You while Your rights were valid, provided those recipients remain in compliance with this License.

18.7 Survival

Sections that by their nature should survive termination, including Sections 10 through 12 and 15 through 26, survive termination.

19. COMPLIANCE, NOTICE, AND REMEDIES

You may request written clarification from the applicable Licensor concerning a proposed Use. Silence or delay does not constitute approval, waiver, or permission.

No person may represent that a Licensor has approved a Use unless the Licensor has given express written approval.

An applicable Licensor may provide written notice of a suspected breach and may seek any legal or equitable remedy available under applicable law. This License does not create a remedy that applicable law does not recognize.

Except where urgent action is reasonably necessary to prevent serious harm, the parties are encouraged to attempt good-faith resolution before litigation. This sentence does not limit a party's right to seek immediate injunctive or other equitable relief where available.

Failure to enforce a provision on one occasion is not a waiver of that provision or of a later breach.

No person other than an applicable Licensor or a lawful successor to that Licensor may enforce this License solely by reason of being a member of the public.

20. CONTRIBUTIONS

Unless a Contributor and Licensor expressly agree otherwise in writing, a Contribution intentionally submitted and accepted for inclusion in BCL Material is licensed under this License.

Each Contributor grants the rights stated in Sections 2 and 12 only to the extent the Contributor possesses those rights in the accepted Contribution.

This Section does not transfer ownership of a Contribution. It does not override a separate contributor license agreement, employment agreement, or other written agreement governing that Contribution.

21. TRADEMARKS, ATTRIBUTION, AND NO ENDORSEMENT

This License does not grant permission to use a Licensor's trade names, trademarks, service marks, logos, or product names, except as reasonably necessary to preserve required notices, identify the origin of BCL Material, or state accurately that material is licensed under the BCL.

Use of BCL Material does not imply sponsorship, approval, or endorsement by a Licensor or Contributor.

22. DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTY

To the maximum extent permitted by applicable law, BCL Material and each Contribution are provided "AS IS" and "AS AVAILABLE," without warranties or conditions of any kind, express, implied, or statutory, including warranties or conditions of title, non-infringement, merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, accuracy, security, or absence of defects.

You are solely responsible for determining whether BCL Material is appropriate for Your purposes and for the risks associated with Your Use of it.

Nothing in this Section excludes a warranty or right that applicable law does not permit to be excluded.

23. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

To the maximum extent permitted by applicable law, no Licensor or Contributor is liable under any legal theory for direct, indirect, incidental, special, exemplary, punitive, or consequential damages arising from this License or the Use of, or inability to Use, BCL Material, including loss of data, profits, goodwill, business opportunity, or operational continuity, even if advised that such damages were possible.

This limitation does not apply to liability that applicable law does not permit to be limited or excluded, or to a separate written agreement expressly accepting additional liability.

24. ADDITIONAL WARRANTY OR LIABILITY

When distributing BCL Material, You may offer support, warranty, indemnity, or other obligations for a fee or otherwise, but only on Your own behalf and responsibility.

You may not represent that a Licensor or Contributor accepts those obligations. If Your additional obligations cause a claim against a Licensor or Contributor, You agree to defend and indemnify that person to the extent permitted by applicable law.

25. INTERPRETATION, SEVERABILITY, AND SEPARATE AGREEMENTS

Headings are for convenience and do not limit the meaning of this License. "Including" means "including without limitation." The singular includes the plural and the plural includes the singular where context permits.
